## Reading

The children will have daily phase one listening sessions, rhyme time sessions with nursery rhymes and lots of quality stories.

Some of our key texts and rhymes this half term are:

- The Gruffalo
- Stickman
- We're going on a bear hunt
- A selection of Christmas stories

## Maths

Children will be developing fast recognition of 3 objects, reciting numbers past 5, say one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4,5. Compare quantities using language: 'more than', 'fewer than' and understand that the last number they count is the total amount.

Children will be taught this through direct teaching each day and also have plentiful opportunities to apply this throughout the provision.

## Understanding the World

This term children will be exploring the seasons and how they change. We have enjoyed exploring signs of autumn and we will now look at how autumn changes to winter. It is wonderful to be able to take the children on walks around our school grounds to explore these changes and observe nature.

We will also be looking at celebrations such as bonfire night and Christmas.

We look forward to watching our children participate in our own Nativity to celebrate Christmas.

Children will take part in lots of different mark making activities and fine motor skills. This will be through play and endless opportunities to explore their own marks and understanding what their own marks mean.
